

#### **Training In Suicide Care Workshop**

On **Monday, April 29**, we will be offering Training in Suicide Care for Physicians (TSCP). This training provides an opportunity for you to complete your full 6 hour licensing obligation which promotes the physician's leadership role in understanding and addressing this preventable cause of morbidity and mortality. The workshop targets general competence in suicide risk assessment, treatment and management and is based on existing practice guidelines which includes the SPRC Core Competencies in Suicide Risk Assessment and Management, the APA Practice Guideline for the Assessment and Treatment of Patients with Suicidal Behaviors (2003) and the National Action Alliance for Suicide Prevention's report, Suicide Care in Systems Framework (2011).

**IMPORTANT**: This curriculum has been approved by the Washington State Department of Health to meet the requirement for training in suicide risk assessment, treatment and management for health care professionals.



This Botox injection workshop is for beginners who are interested in learning how to inject Botox for cosmetic purposes. Glabella, forehead, crow's feet, vertical lip lines, DAO, and jaw reduction will all be discussed.
